



Dual Enrollment (DE) Program Changes FAQs

On Tuesday, September 25, 2018, State College of Florida's (SCF) Board of Trustees approved a proposal to offer SCF dual enrollment classes in the fall and spring semesters on an SCF campus or online taught by SCF faculty, effective July 1, 2019.

Why did SCF propose a change to its DE program?

SCF thoroughly evaluated our dual enrollment program over the past year and a half as the result of academic quality inconsistencies discovered throughout the program when administered offsite. Quality inconsistencies related to course rigor, faculty oversight, academic support and guidance were not meeting SCF quality standards. Furthermore, improvements to the delivery of the program align it with the newly adopted policy by our accrediting agency, Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACS-COC).

What will be available to students next school year?

Students can take dual enrollment classes in the fall and spring semesters on an SCF campus or online. The classes will be taught by SCF faculty, providing the students with a college-level experience and access to the College resources they need to succeed.

What about transportation?

Online courses are available to students who are not able to find personal transportation or use public transportation.
