Developmental courses and prerequisite course requirements, credit load and/or course availability may affect a student's individual progress. The pathway below is specifically intended for full-time students who begin their course work with the Fall semester. Most of the prerequisite courses for the Studio Art Pathway are taken care of in the first year. The General Education requirements are distributed throughout the four semesters to allow students to begin taking their art courses in the first semester. Within the second year, students may begin to customize their focus by selecting elective courses within Art, Design & Humanities that better fit their interests. Students may enroll in any ART or PGY courses they would like. Students pursuing Ceramics may enroll in Wheel Throwing I and Sculpture, while students interested in Painting may enroll in Painting I and Figure Drawing.

Students must meet the foreign language requirement of having completed two sequential foreign language courses in high school or at the postsecondary level (8 semester hours). Foreign language requirement has not been built into A.A. transfer pathway and will be additional requirement, if needed, prior to completion of Associate of Arts degree.
