THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES -- STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA, MANATEE – SARASOTA REGULAR MEETING

Date: September 30, 2025 5:30 p.m. **Location:** SCF Bradenton

Proceedings:

The District Board of Trustees of State College of Florida, Manatee – Sarasota held a Regular Meeting on September 24, 2024 at SCF Bradenton.

Board Members Present: Taylor Collins, Lon Deckard, Mike Fuller, Mark Goodson, Jennifer Infanti, Britt Riner, Karen Rose, and Rod Thomson Absent: Jamie DiDomenico

Administrators Present: President Tommy Gregory, Vice Presidents Dr. Ryan Hale, Jennifer Price, Dr. Brittany Pyjas, and Chris Wellman, Interim Provost Dr. Patricia Rand, and General Counsel Steve Prouty.

1. Meeting Call to Order - Mr. Thomson

Mr. Thomson called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm.

2. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Dr. Nielsen delivered the invocation and led the pledge.

3. Public Comment

Faculty Member Jason Reed thanked the Board for their support of the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) club and introduced two of the SCF student club members.

4. Organizational Meeting

President Gregory called the Organizational Meeting to order. President Gregory asked for nominations for Chair. Mr. Thomson seconded, and the board unanimously approved.

President Gregory reminded the board of the structure of the President's contract that includes compensation for the achievement of the agreed upon goals. Manatees Athletics 2024-25 Year in Review

The 2024–25 academic year was marked by numerous proud achievements across State College of Florida's Athletics Department. The standout accomplishment came from the Beach Volleyball program, which finished as the NJCAA National Runner-Up—the highest national finish ever by a women's team in SCF Athletics history.

The Beach Volleyball team achieved several significant milestones this season. The program produced its first-ever NJCAA All-Americans, with four student-athletes earning the honor—a remarkable feat in a single year. Additionally, Aleksandra Wrobel was named the NJCAA Beach Volleyball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, another first for the program. The team also secured a second-place finish in the state, marking the highest state-level placement in program history.

The Baseball program continued its tradition of excellence, advancing to the FCSAA Division I Baseball Championship after defeating Northwest Florida State College in a best-of-three postseason series. Lochlan Radloff was named FCSAA Pitcher of the Year and earned Pitcher of the Week honors four times during the regular season. Adding to the program's legacy, former SCF pitcher Liam Best (2022–2024) was selected by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 19th round of the 2025 MLB First-Year Player Draft.

The Court Volleyball and Softball programs underwent transitional seasons under new leadership. Both teams welcomed new head coaches to guide their rebuilding efforts. Court Volleyball saw strong contributions from local talent, including three recruits from Braden River High School. Aryanna Spainhower, a dual-sport athlete, garnered state and national recognition in both Beach and Indoor Volleyball.

The Softball team posted its strongest offensive performance since the 2018–2019 season, finishing with a .305 batting average, .385 on-base percentage, and .419 slugging percentage. Under Head Coach Brett Sauerwein, the program experienced a comprehensive overhaul. Looking ahead, the 2025–26 recruiting class is poised for success, highlighted by the commitment of Allison Cole, a top pitcher from Riverview Sarasota High School, and one of Florida's premier prospects.

Academically, SCF Athletics continued its strong performance in the classroom. For the third consecutive year, all athletic programs maintained a team GPA of 3.0 or higher. Every team was recognized as an NJCAA and FCSAA Academic Team of the Year. The Baseball program also earned the American Baseball Coaches Association Academic Excellence Award, one of only two programs in Florida to receive this distinction.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER CONTRACT BETWEEN THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA, MANATEE-SARASOTA, ON BEHALF OF STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA COLLEGIATE SCHOOL AND THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MANATEE COUNTY FLORIDA

The parties hereby agree to amend the Charter contract entered into by and between THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MANATEE COUNTY, FLORIDA, a political subdivision operating and existing under the laws of the State of Florida, referred to therein as "SPONSOR" and THE DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA, MANATEE-SARASOTA, ON BEHALF OF STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA COLLEGIATE SCHOOL, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, referred to therein as "SCHOOL" as follows:

WHEREAS the parties have previously entered into a Charter Contract ("Charter") with a term commencing on July 1, 2015, and ending on June 30, 2030;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, and for the other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereby amend the Charter as follows:

- 1. Sales Tax Revenue Share Disbursements to the School by the Sponsor will be based on the Sponsor's actual, collected sales tax revenue from the Financial Management Department of Manatee County less Maximum Annual Debt Service payments and any other payments related to the Sponsor's current sales tax revenue bonds. Payments from any future debt obligations after September 1, 2025, not issued under the Sales Tax Bond Resolution, shall be paid in whole or in part from the Sponsor's proportionate share from sales tax revenues in effect for the current sales tax revenue that expires on December 31, 2032.
- 2. The School's proportionate share will be based on the School FTE per most recent FDOE surveys in effect for that month (not school projections).
- 3. The School shall expend any Sales Tax Revenue Share Disbursements solely for purposes of capital expenditures to reduce overcrowding, reduce portable classrooms, renovate existing schools within the School District of Manatee County, Florida, build new schools within Manatee County, Florida, purchase technology, and improve student safety and achievement, and for such other purposes as approved by ballot-voted referenda of the citizens of Manatee County, Florida. Neither the proceeds of any Sales Tax Revenue Share Disbursements, nor the interest accrued thereto, shall be used for operational expenses of the receiving School. The School will be required to provide detailed, system-generated monthly and annual expenditures reports to the Sponsor for monitoring and audit purposes by the Sponsor's appointed independent citizens committee.
- 4. The School shall cooperate fully and in good faith with the Sponsor's auditors and the citizen review oversight committee appointed by the School Board of Manatee County, Florida. The School shall be responsible for reimbursing the Sponsor for the School's proportionate share of all outside audit costs from any School's Sales Tax Revenue Share Disbursements. The School shall spend the funds appropriately and have the

- expenditures of those funds audited annually to ensure compliance with the tax resolution language no later than nine (9) months after fiscal year end.
- 5. Once final FTE information is available, the reconciliation of the sales tax revenue to FTE will be performed by the Sponsor and any adjustment will be made to the following monthly School disbursement.
- 6. If the funds are not spent by the School in accordance with Section 1013.62, Florida Statutes, or this Agreement, the Sponsor shall take recourse with the charter school including, but not limited to recoupment from subsequent Sales Tax Revenue Share Disbursements to the School or may withhold future payments until the School is in compliance.
- 7. The Sponsor's responsibility will be to equitably disburse funds based on unrestricted revenue collections and revenue collections disbursed will be reconciled with final FTE calculations.
- 8. The School's share on a graduated scale sales surtax for the School in 2025-2026, will be 50% of the proportionate share of the Sponsor's anticipated revenue collected less Sales Tax Revenue Bond debt service payments. This amount will be divided by the Sponsor's total capital outlay FTE equivalent membership and the total number of FTE equivalent of each of the Sponsor's eligible charter schools, then multiplied by eligible Charter School FTE per the most recent FDOE survey in effect. A roll in method of shared distribution starting with 50% in 25/26, 60% in 26/27, 80% in 27/28, and 100% thereafter.

WHEREFORE, the parties herby execute this 1^{ST} Amendment to the Charter with the intention of being legally bound thereby, effective as of the las date set forth below.

SUBJECT: Monthly Financial Report – August 2025

Two Year Programs

The report for Two Year Programs presents the Budget and Year-To-Date Revenue and Expense for this fiscal year and last fiscal year as of August 31, 2025.

Student Fees revenue for the current year is 4% higher compared to the same period last year. Other Student Fees revenue increased by 73% over Other Student Fees reported through August of last year. Support from Local Government decreased by 100% over Support from Local Government through August of last year. The variances in Other Student Fees and State Support are the result of a classification change made to Dual Enrollment revenues. State Support increased by 5% over State Support through August of last year.

In the category of Expenses, overall Personnel costs are 11% lower as compared to last August. Expense for Services decreased 2% and Materials and Supplies expenses increased by 63% compared to August of last year. Other Current Charges increased by 94% compared to the same category through August of last year.

With the year 17% complete, personnel costs are at 8% of the amount budgeted for the current year, which is equal to the three-year average for this time of year. Current expenses represent 19% of the amount budgeted, higher than the three-year average of 14% this time of year.

In summary, with the year 17% complete:

- Year-To-Date Actual Revenue is 24% of the Adjusted Budget, which is equal to the three-year average for this time of year.
- Year-To-Date Actual Expense is 12% of the Adjusted Budget, which is higher than the three-year average of 10% for this time of year.
- Revenues are higher and expenses are lower than would be expected as a percentage of budget.

Baccalaureate Programs

The report for Baccalaureate Programs presents the Budget and Year-To-Date Revenue and Expense for this fiscal year and last fiscal year as of August 31, 2025.

Student Fees revenue for the current year is 1% higher compared to the same period last year. Other Student Fees revenue increased by 14% compared to August of last year. State Support decreased 19% compared to the same period last year.

In the category of Expenses, overall Personnel costs are unchanged compared to last August. Expenses for Services and Materials and Supplies are minimum for both years. Other Current Charges decreased 96% compared to the same category through August of last.

With this year 17% complete, revenue is 31% of the amount budgeted for the current year, which is lower compared to the three-year average of 34%. Overall expenses are 5% of the actual budgeted amount compared to the 6% three-year average. Personnel costs are 6% of the amount budgeted for the current year, equal to the three-year average for this time of year. Current expenses represent 0% of the amount budgeted, lower than the three-year average of 5% this time of year.

Collegiate School - Bradenton Campus

Total Revenue for Collegiate School consists of Support from Local Government, State Support, Federal Support, and Other Revenue. Total Revenue as of August 31, 2025, totaled \$718,676 compared to the three-year average of \$710,888. Support from Local Government is \$681,637 compared to the three-year average of \$682,367 for this time of year. State support is \$17,870 compared to the three-year average of \$23,091 for this time of year. Other Revenue is \$19,169 comparing to the three-year average of \$19,573 for this time of year.

Total Expense for Collegiate School consists of Personnel, Current and Capital Outlay expenses. Total Expense is \$476,117, with Personnel totaling \$257,395, Current Expense totaling \$137,889 and Capital Outlay totaling \$80,833. These figures compare to the three-year averages of \$233,672, \$15,387, \$94,266 and \$174,526, respectively, for this time of year. The increase in Current Expenses is due to timing of iPad lease/purchase payment.

On a percentage basis, Total Revenue is 14% of that budgeted compared to the three-year average of 16% this time of year. Total Expense is 8% of that budgeted, which is equal to the three-year average for this time of year.

Collegiate School - Venice Campus

Total Revenue for Collegiate School consists of Support from Local Government, State Support, Federal Support, and Other Revenue. Total Revenue as of August 31, 2025, totaled \$526,726 compared to the three-year average of \$452,181. Support from Local Government is \$521,362 compared to the three-year average of \$470,530 for this time of year. Other Revenue is \$5,364 comparing to the three-year average of \$3,394 for this time of year.

Total Expense for Collegiate School consists of Personnel, Current and Capital Outlay expenses. Total Expense is \$205,372, with Personnel totaling \$126,440, Current Expense totaling \$41,506 and Capital Outlay totaling \$37,426. These figures compare to the three-year averages of \$114,092, \$21,450, and \$13,542, respectively.

On a percentage basis, Total Revenue is 16% of that budgeted, which is equal to the three-year average for the same period. Total Expense is 7% of that budgeted compared to the three-year average of 6% this time of year.

GRANT SUMMARY:

State College of Florida, Manatee-Sarasota (SCF) is requesting \$50,000 from the Global Technology Industry Association (GTIA) to launch the Expanding Access through Online Course Quality and Faculty Development project. This initiative is designed to remove barriers to success for students from low-income backgrounds, students with disabilities, first-generation college students, and English language learners by improving the accessibility and instructional quality of SCF's online courses. The project will leverage digital accessibility software and targeted faculty training to create more supportive and engaging online learning environments.

Grant funds will be used to purchase and implement accessibility software that integrates with SCF's learning management system and automatically scans and remediates course content to meet Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG). In addition, up to 50 faculty members will participate in two nationally recognized Online Learning Consortium (OLC) workshops focused on accessible course design and regular, substantive interaction. These faculty members will then become internal champions to share their expertise with colleagues and ensure that the benefits of the project extend across the institution. The project is expected to serve at least 7,488 students currently enrolled in online and hybrid courses, with the potential to positively impact all SCF students as accessible practices are adopted more broadly.

The Expanding Access project will be implemented over two years, with a clear plan for sustainability. After foundational improvements are made, SCF will transition to a train-the-trainer model and use enrollment revenue from increased demand for online courses to support ongoing software costs. This initiative aligns with GTIA's and SCF's mission by using technology to provide engaging and accessible learning environments and expand educational opportunities for not just historically underserved students, but all students.

Contract Approval for Parrish Phase 1 Development

RECOMMENDATION:

The College recommends approval by the Board of Trustees for the contract with Tandem Construction to construct a new multi-purpose building at the Parrish campus.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The Board previously approved this project, and the use of Construction Management as the project delivery method. Design was completed and bid documents prepared for the proposed 45,000 s.f. multipurpose building including site work and infrastructure. Through the Consultant Competitive Negotiation Act process, Tandem Construction was selected for the Parrish Phase 1 Development. Tandem Construction advertised and obtained competitive subcontractor bids per Florida Statute. The cost of construction, totaling \$33,983,264.80 including general conditions, subcontractor costs, overhead and profit have been evaluated by SCF College Staff and are found to be fair and reasonable. This amount is also within the established project budget of \$39,265,385.00. Therefore, requesting Board approval to contract with Tandem Construction for \$33,983,264.80. Pending approval, construction will commence November 2025 and conclude April 2027.
